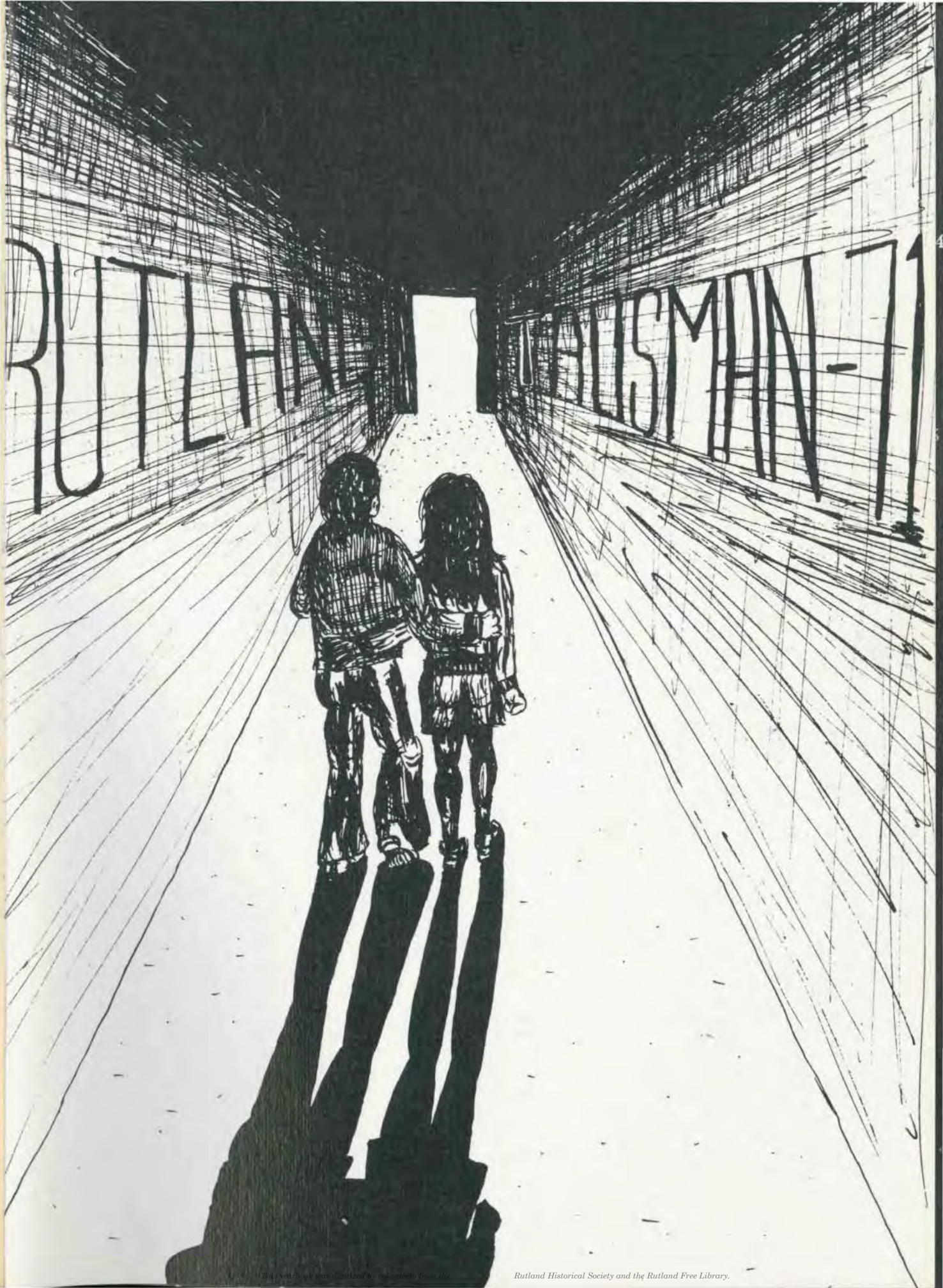




TALISMAN

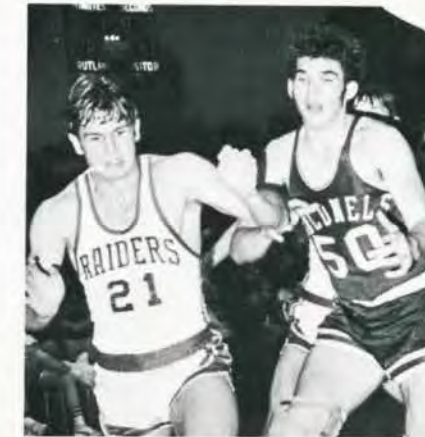


Basketball

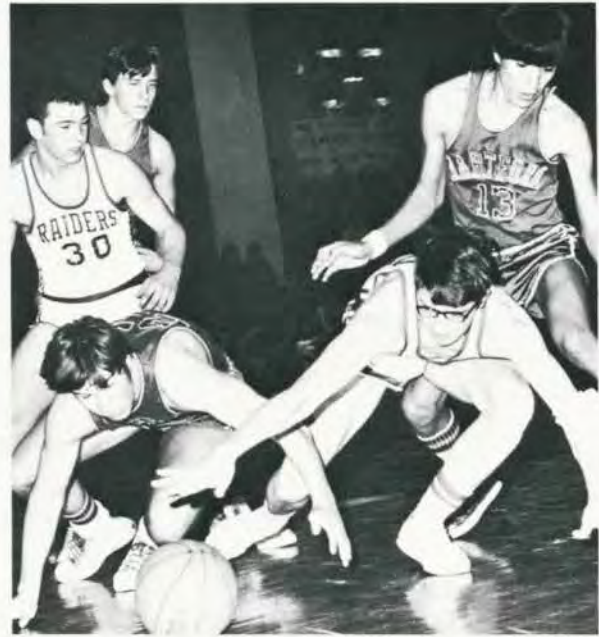

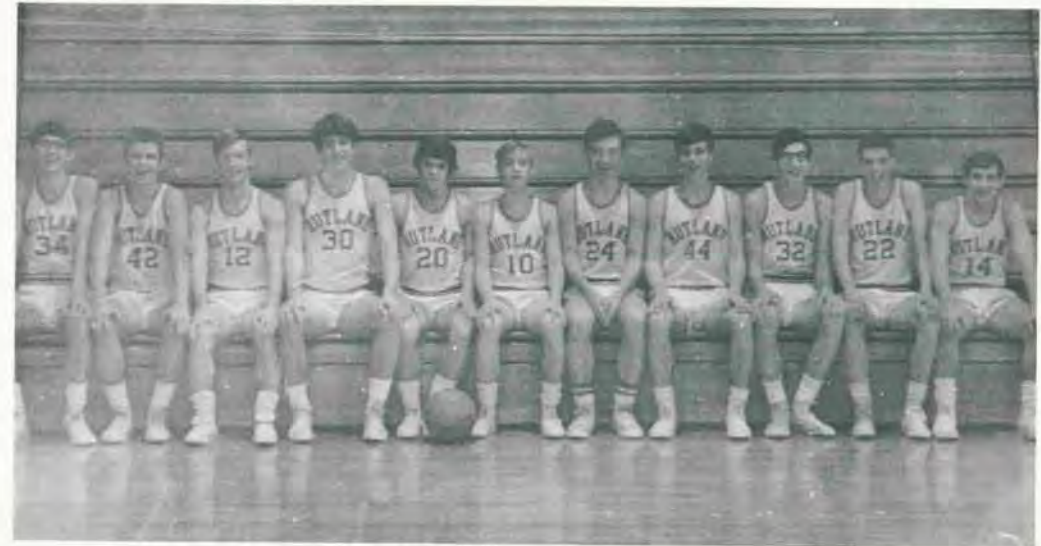

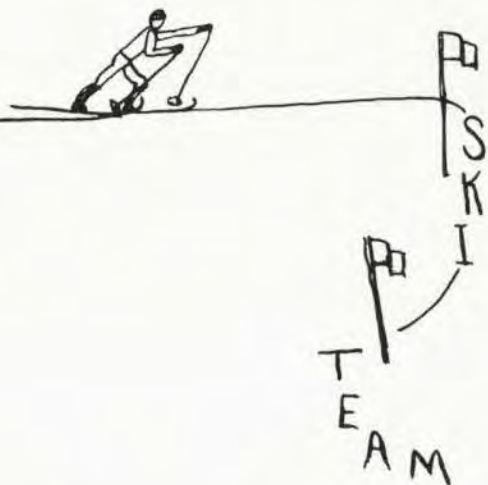
Rutland High School's Indoor Track team had another good season in 1971. The Dartmouth Leverone Field House was again the site of the Raiders track meets. The Raiders routed Springfield in the first meet of the season and followed with a devastating triumph over Lyndon. In the Winter League Championships at Dartmouth, the Raiders lost by one point to Springfield 69 1/2 to 68 1/2. Some of the qualifiers in this meet were chosen by Coach Short to go to the Tri-States at Colby College, Maine. Junior Frank Elnicki set a New England record in the 300-yard run at 32.5 seconds.

The Raider runners were led by tri-captains Tom Garofano, Dave Wolk and Les Cyr. Other senior stalwarts included Vic Segale, who placed fifth in the state in the 600-yard run; Dave Cook, the top R.H.S. hurdler and a shotputter; Mike Romano, 300-yard run; Mike Briggs, 600-yard run; and Dave Alberico, who is the top weight man in the school. Tom and Dave both run the sprints—the 50-yard dash and the 300-yard run plus the relay. Les Cyr ran the 600 and the relay.

The season was definitely a success, and was a good omen for the outdoor track team, where the seniors would seek their first state championship ever in high school athletic competition.

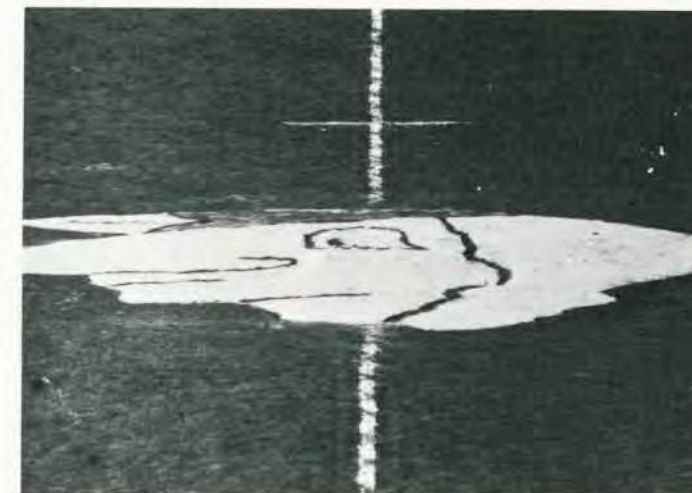

RHS Athletics In Review

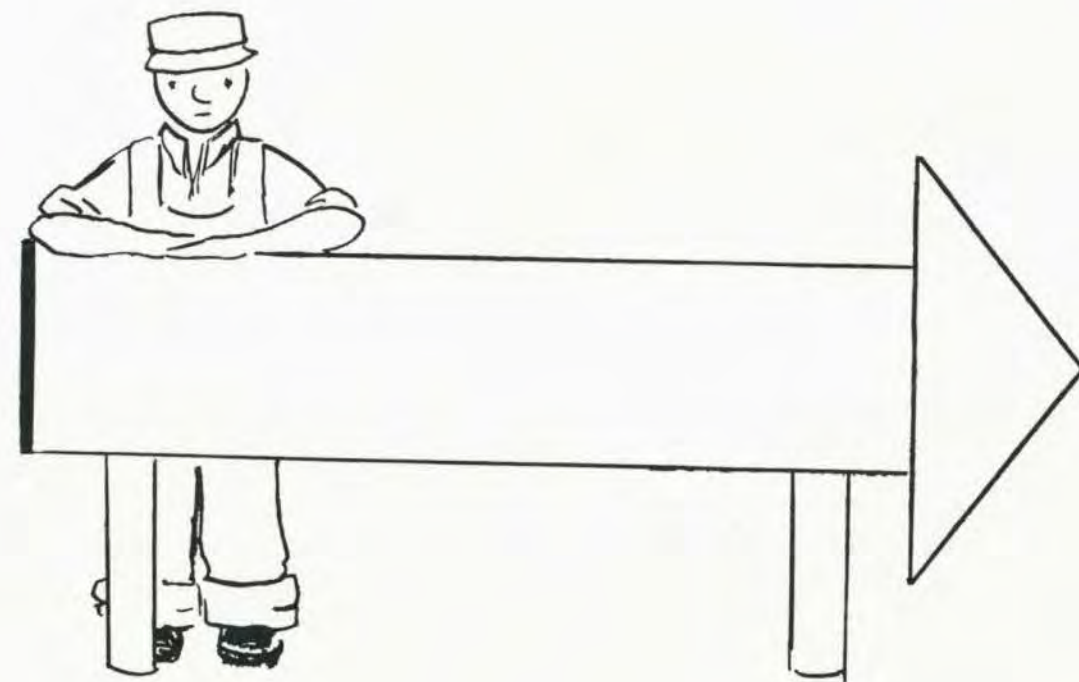

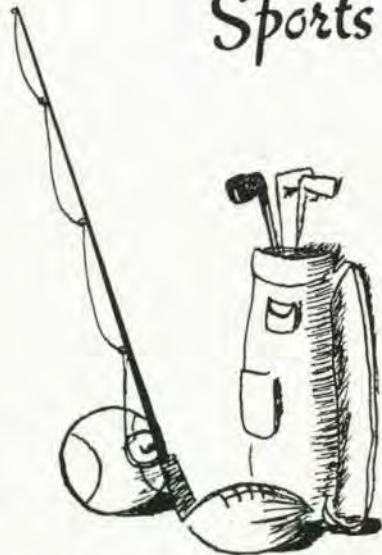

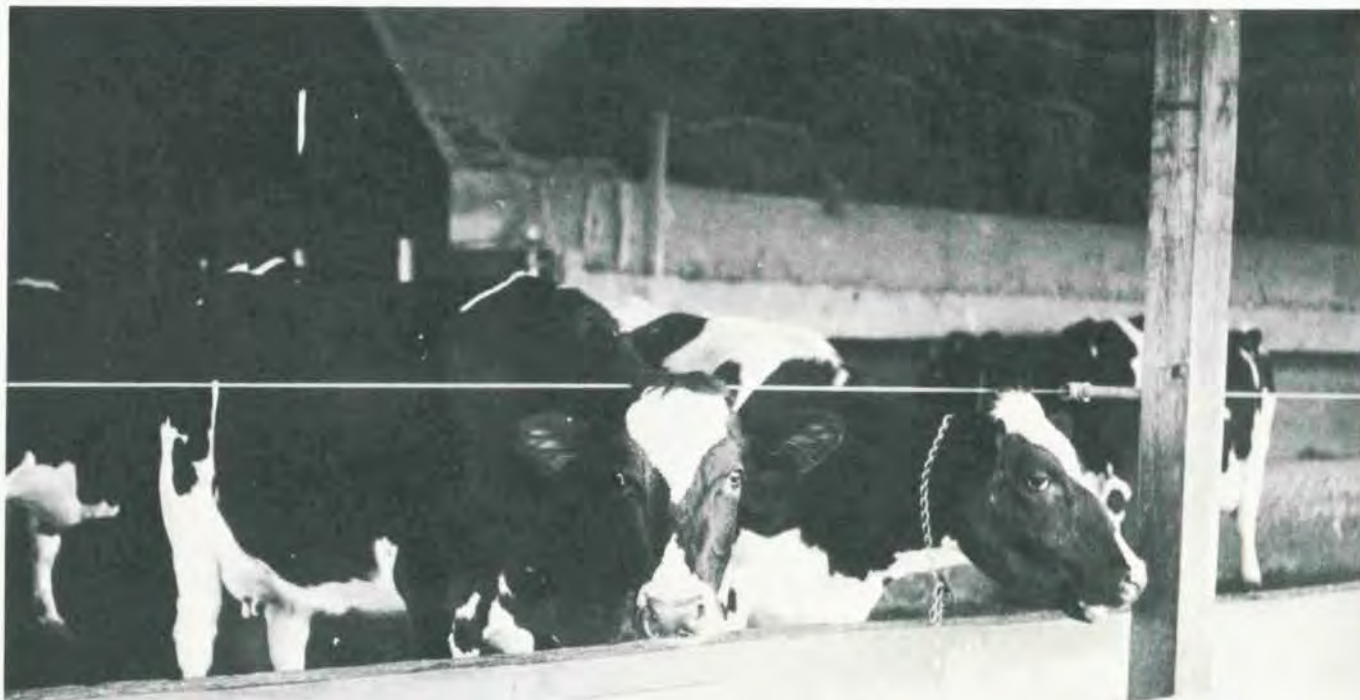
