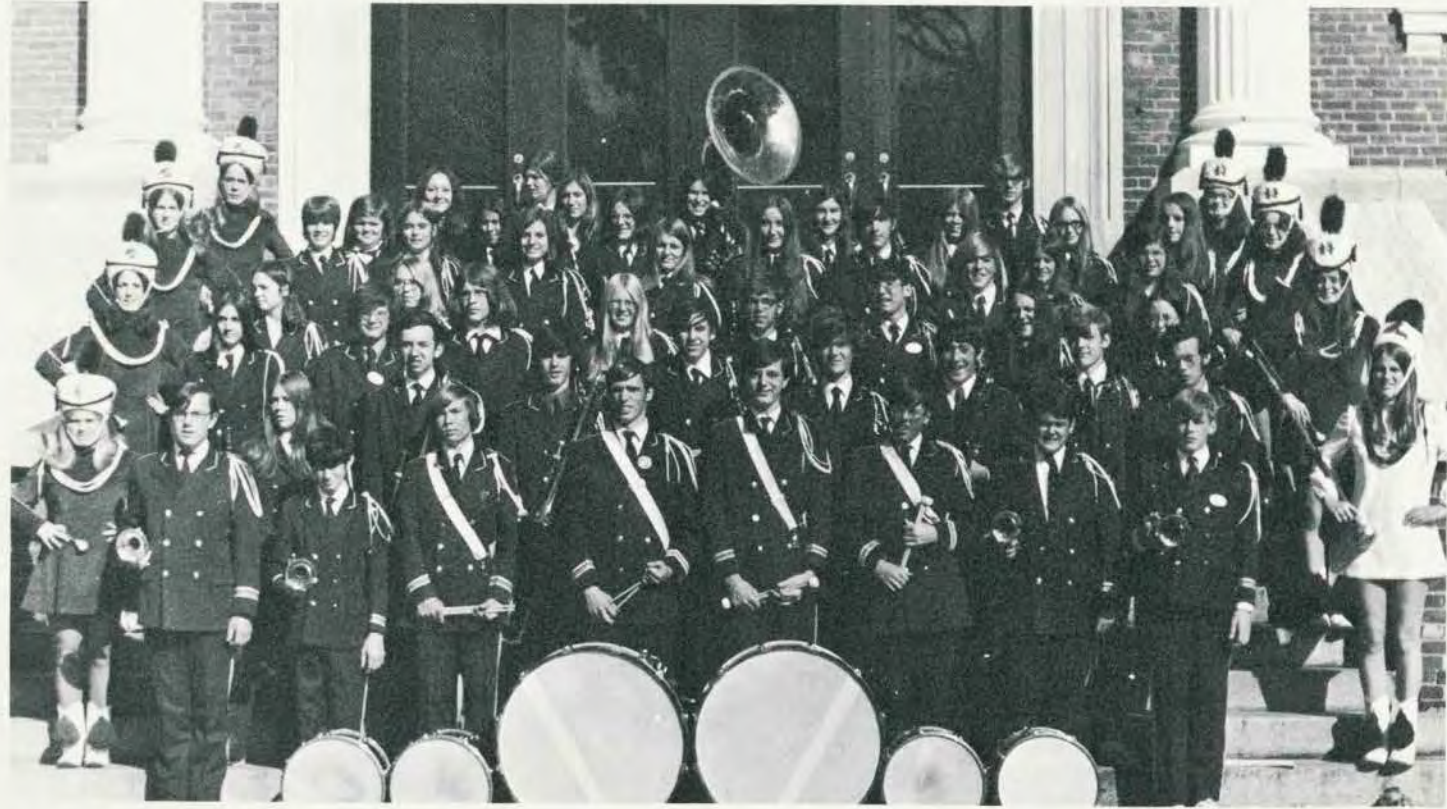
CHORUS

The main project of the year was the establishment of a \$1000.00 scholarship fund through several money-raising events. The scholarships are to be given to two seniors going on to major in music in college.

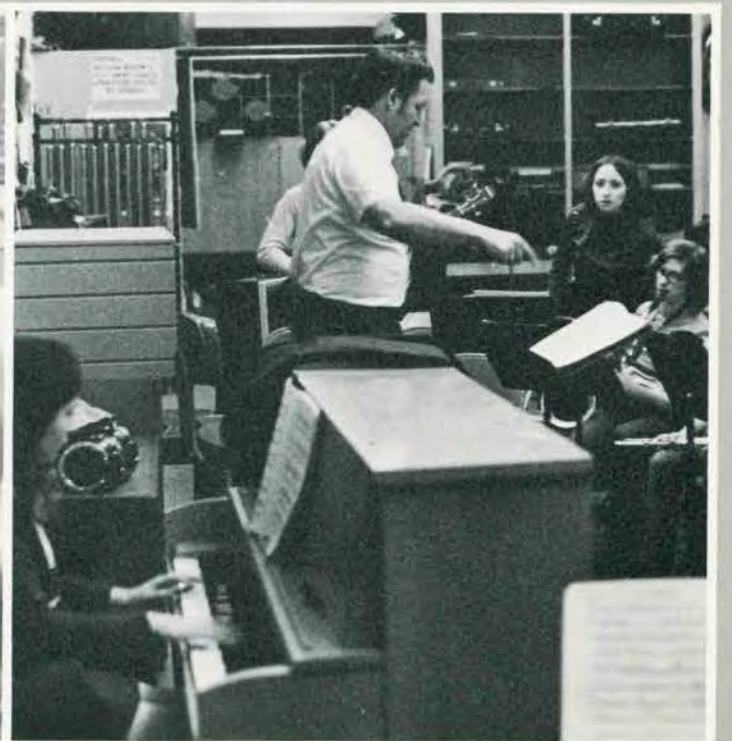
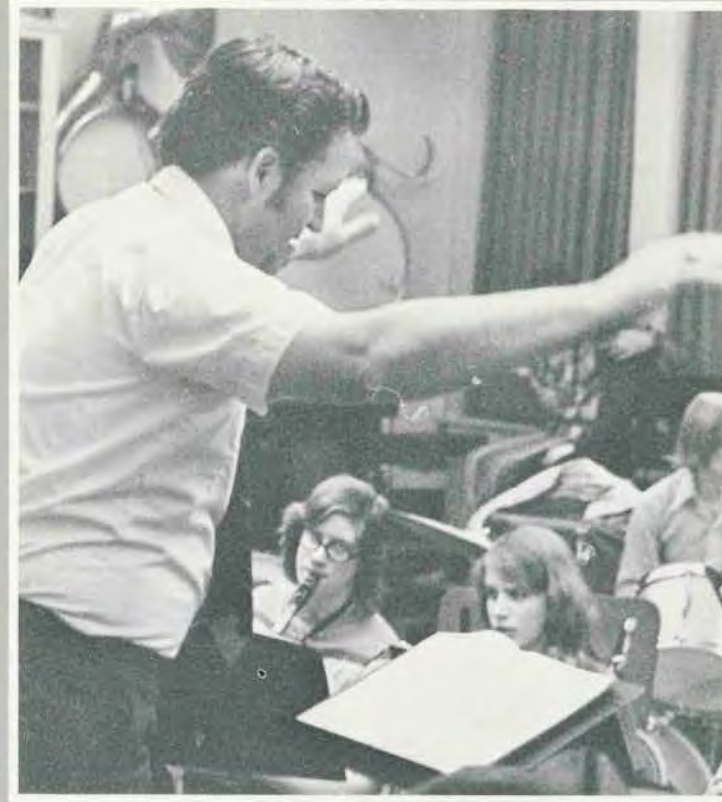
